Each Forum has a special theme, which is sub-divided into several tracks to accommodate special interests and various fields of expertise and specialisation.

Main Requirements for Hosting an EAIR Forum:

- Forum to be held last week of August or first week of September
- Three and a half day conference:
Sun (0.5)-Mon-Tue-Wed or
Sat (0.5)-Sun-Mon-Tue
- Presentation Rooms (Fully AV equipped)
1 Auditorium (350-400 capacity),
1 meeting room & 1 office room
 - 3-4 Presentation Rooms (60-75)
 - 5-6 Presentation Rooms (40-50)
- Coffee/Tea Break & Lunch facilities
- Welcome Reception & Social Dinner Event
